### Vicar's Letter,

The Church dedicated to St Matthew on Fromes Hill was originally built in the mid 1800's by the vicar of Bishops Frome. It was built as a chapel of ease to serve the growing number of parishioners in the village and maybe even in response to the appearance of the nonconformist chapel which is now a private dwelling on the main road. The church has faithfully served the people of Fromes Hill for well over 150 years but of late the congregation has dwindled and those trying to keep up with all the tasks that need attention, even in such a small church, have been struggling. With this in mind and after local consultation the decision was made to ask the Diocese if we could close the church.



This isn't anyone's fault, although there will always be those who want somebody to blame. We have to accept that peoples lives these days are very different from the lives of those in the past where people lived, worked and worshipped locally. These days we live in a very different kind of society to people 150 years ago. People these days are generally very mobile, there are lots of choices available to us about how we spend our time. Even those who are regular worshippers can choose where they want to go to church and find a service to suit their own tastes. Sadly, we find ourselves part of a more disjointed society that often pursues its own interests over those of the community.

Although the Diocese still have much legal work to complete before they take over the building and officially close the church, the church community at Fromes Hill have made the decision to hold their final service on 30<sup>th</sup> April at 10am. This will be a Group Service where we can all gather as a benefice to give thanks for St Matthew's Church and all that the worshipping community there has contributed to the life of the village and the benefice over the years.

When all the legal paperwork is finalised there will be a new parish created of Bishops Frome and Fromes Hill for which St. May the Virgin in Bishops Frome will be the parish church.

The day after the final service at St Matthews is May Day and you will see elsewhere in this edition of the Frome Valley News a May Day Walk and breakfast advertised for the Bank Holiday. For those who are able to join us we will meet in the churchyard at St Matthews and walk down to Bishops Frome Village Centre where a Full English breakfast will be served. It will be a very symbolic walk as the two churches join together to form one parish, or should I say to re-form the one parish that they once were?

On the following Sunday, 7<sup>th</sup> May we will officially welcome the people of Fromes Hill to St Mary's at the High Mass service where we will also be offering prayers for the coronation of King Charles III.

In these times of uncertainty and change I'm mindful of saying I once heard, "change is inevitable, growth is optional." I do pray that we can all grow through the many changes that we are facing as a church and that we would continue to keep our eyes fixed on Jesus the author and perfecter of our faith. (Hebrews 12:2)

## **Deanery Synod Report**

## The Deanery Synod met on 26th February.

There was a talk on Safeguarding at Parish Level given by the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer Mandy McPhee. Mandy outlined the needs of the churches, PCC's and their requirements. The members of the PCC should have done a basic foundation course and obtained a Certificate for Safeguarding. This is a legal requirement for all members and can be completed online or by attending training.

Safeguarding covers children, young people, vulnerable adults and the elderly.

Mandy pointed out that as Christians we have a duty of care to those we meet at church, and those in our community who do not necessarily attend church but about who we may be concerned. Information is confidential.

Our local Safeguarding officer is Eleanor Morris 01885 490 229.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday 21st June at St Mary's Bishops Frome. This will be a joint meeting with Ledbury Deanery where we will interview the Archdeacon of Hereford about the future of the church in our area and the Diocesan proposal to amalgamate the Bromyard and Ledbury Deaneries. This meeting is open to all.

#### **Butterflies on the wing**



This time of year, it is a joy to visit the churchyard and watch our early butterflies fluttering in the spring sunshine. A sure sign winter is behind us. Later in the year, the churchyard meadow is a perfect place to sit in peace and enjoy a show of summer butterflies.

Butterflies and their caterpillars are a food source for many birds. They also pollinate plants and act as sensitive indicators of the health of our environment. #### EASTER CELEBRATIONS

The week before Easter is called Holy Week and includes Maundy Thursday, which observes Jesus' last supper with his disciples; & Good Friday, which honours the day He was crucified, died and was buried. Holy Week is celebrated during the week leading up to Easter. It begins on Palm Sunday, continues to Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and then, Easter Sunday.

It's spring-cleaning time! Do you know about Tom Collingwood? He's the gentleman who has single-handedly picked up over a thousand bags of litter over the past few years, litter-picking along Herefordshire's roads. Isn't that amazing? Recently he's been clearing the A438 between Ledbury and Hereford, and local WhatsApp groups have been buzzing with praise for him. A crowd-funder has been set up to show thanks to him, and I've personally written to Balfour Beatty to ask if they can give him a job... That degree of commitment, hard work, get up and go, and attention to detail surely deserve reward!



I go litter-picking every month as part of my 'Sunday Service', together with various wonderful volunteers – and I know there are also many people who quietly clean up their local area by themselves.

Litter-picking is one of those things that can be looked at in different ways. Sometimes it can be a bit disheartening – especially when you've cleared a patch but then a week or two later someone has thrown rubbish into it again. Sometimes it can feel like a drop in the ocean, or can be tempting to think 'what's the point?' But actually I think there is a lot of point.

Litter-picking shows everybody that somebody cares. It shows that someone feels so strongly that they are prepared to put time into cleaning up someone else's mess. It shows that we care about how our local places look, and it shows that we care about the impact of rubbish on the natural world; sharp metal, fragmenting plastic etc are all terrible for our local wildlife.

We humans are social animals. By litter-picking we're sending a social signal that we care about our local environment, and we're encouraging others to do the same. And at some level I think we are encouraging the tiny minority who do still throw litter out of their windows to think again.

Because it's absolutely true to say that we need to fix problems at their source. In that sense, litter-picking is a sticking-plaster over a wider problem of wasteful throwaway culture. So we need 'both/and', not 'either/or'. Creating a better world is about both trying to stop problems at their source, and doing our best to fix the current problems. That's a rule of thumb that is useful in all sorts of areas, not just litter...

Also – speaking personally – there's a genuine sense of wellbeing that comes with litter-picking! When there's no traffic and you hear the birdsong; when you discover hidden gems like wild flowers; and when people passing hoot and say thank you (and even bring a bottle of sparkling wine to say thanks, as once happened to me!). Plus, you get instant satisfaction – you can really see that you're making a difference and being part of the solution!

Many of us spend our lives trying to make a difference in all sorts of ways – and we don't always get quick or visible results. So let's celebrate the joys of litter-picking, and let's celebrate the Tom Collingwoods of the world!

You can borrow litter-picking kit (litter-pick sticks, hi-vis vests, gloves, purple bags) from the council by phoning 01432 261800. And more volunteers are always very welcome on my 'Sunday Service'! (Usually the second Sunday morning of the month, but not Easter Sunday).






