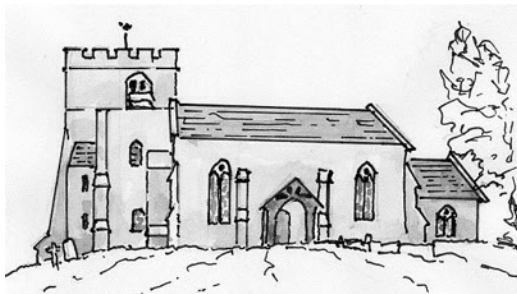
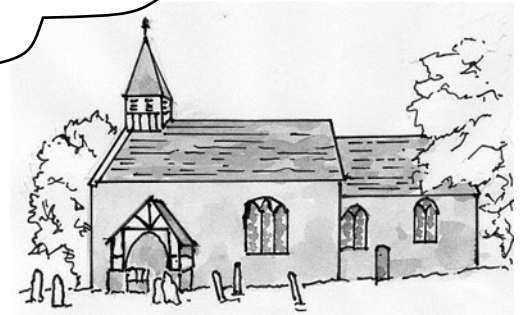

Vicar's Letter - June

'He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8)

As many of you know there is a lot of grass surrounding the vicarage. There is as much grass in the back garden as in the front and I used to spend much time driving a ride on mower about which I constantly damaged on hidden roots or crashed into tree stumps. The mower spent a lot of its time across the road at the garage being repaired.



After a while I realised that I needed a better plan for managing the lawns so, I sold the ride on mower and decided to invest in a small team of three miniature sheep who steadily eat their way through much of the grass throughout the year. Despite having fenced off two large paddocks for the sheep, I do still need to spend time mowing large patches of lawn, both in the front garden and around the back as my wife has prevented me from turning the whole of the vicarage garden into a big sheep field.

Although the rest of the lawn seems to be predominately made up of weeds, it does need cutting every now and then. This usually starts with the first cut of the year in March or April, when I dust down our old petrol mower which fights it's way through the overly long grass. It's hard work, but without the help of my team of little sheep it would be so much harder.

It's all too easy for us as Christians to try and live lives without the power of the Holy Spirit, to try and do everything on our own. As Christians we can easily become disconnected from God's power in our lives. The Father does not want us to do everything in our own strength, but rather as part of a team, working together - and in the power of the Holy Spirit as promised by Jesus in Acts 1:7-8 and fulfilled on the day of Pentecost in Acts 2. It's good to occasionally pause and ask the Lord "Is this something you have called me to do, if so am I doing it in your power or in my own strength?"

As we move from Easter towards Pentecost, my prayer for each one of us is that the Holy Spirit would so fill each of us with the love, the grace, and the power of God, that we would overflow with God's love, grace and power to everyone around us.

Orchids aplenty

On the hill beyond the church, there is surely one of Herefordshire's best displays of common spotted orchids. From early June, look out for the pale pink flower spikes standing tall amongst the meadow grasses. You cannot miss them! Close inspection will reveal the usually purple spotted leaves and the darker dots and streaks on the delicate florets.

And as if that isn't enough, a little later in June keep an eye out for the display of pyramidal orchids on the flower-rich, unmown (deliberately) verge opposite the entrance to Moorend. Their pink, cone-shaped, dense flowerheads stand proud amongst myriad wayside flowers. A wonderful sight.

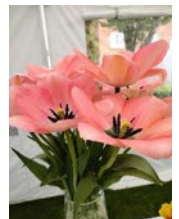

Fromes Hill Recreational Area (The exact location to be defined)

Rational

Residents of Fromes Hill have expressed an interest in the provision of a play recreational area to be developed on the field. Following recent meetings where residents expressed ideas, the project could be widened to include an area for walking that could link to the Public foot path, an area for children's play equipment and adult exercise equipment. An environment over time that would develop biodiversity by planting of trees, shrubs and a wild flower meadow.

The size of the area required and scope to achieve all these requirements will be in part by The Parish Council agreement, securing adequate funding from Parish allocations, applications to public and private funding routes. All of which is attainable.

Next steps

To undertake a survey of residents to gauge ongoing support and encourage further ideas and wider support for the project.

Survey method

- Post a series of questions as below on the Friends of Fromes Hill Face book page.
- Notices in local businesses to raise awareness.
- Door to door survey over two weekends.

Survey questions

- Have you heard of the proposed recreational area in the field?
- From the **rational** above will this project be of interest to you, family and friends?
- Would you be willing to support the project; in time, skills, fund raising, and other ways?
- What types of recreational equipment would you wish to be provided?
- Anything else that you would like to see developed.
- Thank you for your responses.

What next

- Three weeks to gather resident's views.
- Collate the information and prepare a project proposal.
- Review by Trustees and residents at another meeting.
- Present to Parish Council for discussion and approval.
- Work up detailed plans and funding sources. Task and finish group to be established.
- Aim to have works started this year.

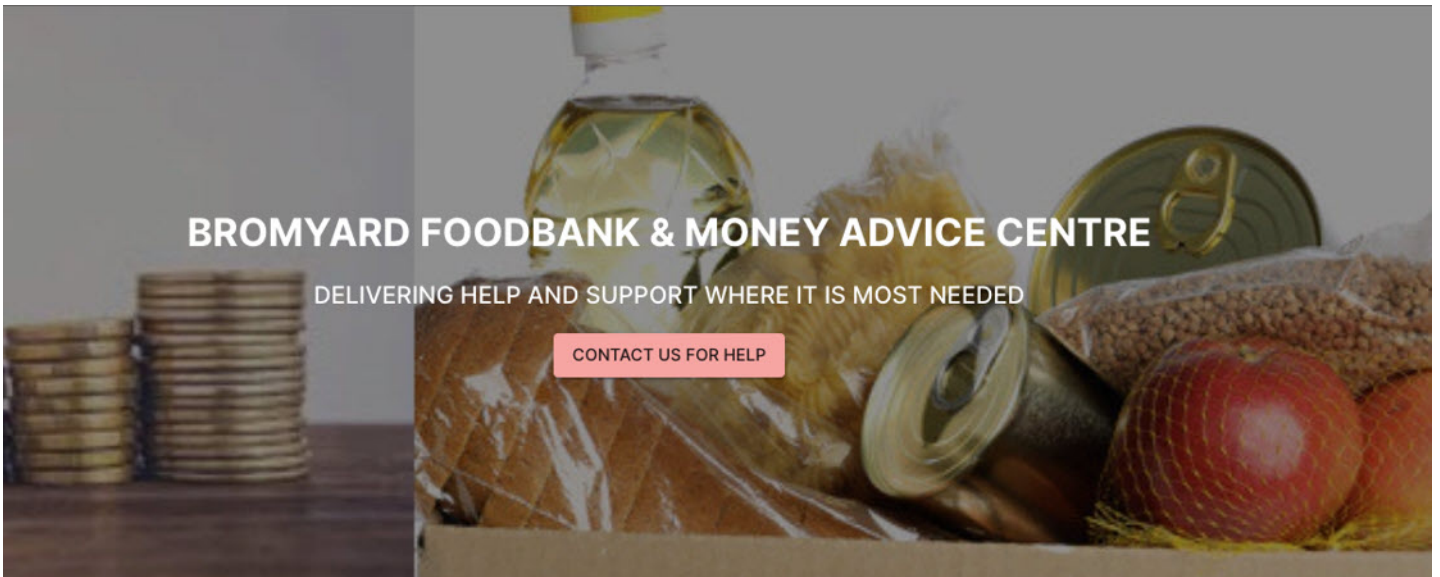

BROMYARD FOODBANK & MONEY ADVICE CENTRE

How time flies, it's over a year since I joined the team, and it has been an incredibly rewarding experience. I have been privileged to work alongside Emma our foodbank co-ordinator and an incredible team of volunteers and trustees who are passionate about making a difference in our community.

I am thrilled to share over the past year, our team has distributed a total of 571 food parcels supporting local families, individuals, and their pets and am proud to say that we have been able to help even more people than before. In 2023 the number of monthly parcels we have distributed has increased by approximately 25%. This year we have also continued to facilitate successful applications for grants for energy and household white goods totalling over £4000 and wider support with e.g., employment working in conjunction with other local charities and organisations. Our trained Money Mentors have similarly been busy supporting clients with free confidential advice on all aspects of money management in some instances achieving life changing results.

Of course, none of this would have been possible without the support of you, our community. Countless individuals and businesses have donated food, money, and time to help us in our mission to help those who are struggling. I want to take this opportunity to extend our deepest gratitude to everyone who has contributed to our cause.

From the local clubs, societies, pub quizzes, churches, schools, collection boxes at the Co-op, Food for All, Morrisons Daily, Scrivens and HOPE Centre and Two Tins Tuesday, online, one off and regular private donors, every little bit has made a difference. The team have seen first-hand the impact that a single donation can have on a family's well-being and are taken aback by the support received.

But I also want to acknowledge that the need for our services is greater than ever, the team will continue to work tirelessly to meet this need, and hope that our community will continue to stand beside us in this effort.

So once again, thank you to everyone who has supported us over the past year, together we can make a difference and ensure that everyone has access to the basic necessities of life.

Martin Jolly

Martin Jolly died peacefully on 6th January 2023 aged 89 surrounded by his family. His funeral service was the 3rd March at St Michael and All Angels, Castle Frome which was attended by family, and friends. When remembering his father in the church service, his son Richard described him as concise, sharp with a quick and keen mind, and witty with a dry sense of humour with which Martin could often catch you off guard with a particular incisive line of questioning. Above all things Martin was deeply generous and kind to those he loved and cared for.

Martin had a difficult childhood losing his father Richard, a naval commander in the early months of WW2 at the age of six. His father was posthumously awarded the George Cross for his heroism and valour. Martin achieved so much professionally in his life. A career as an insurance broker in London at Bowrings; moving to Herefordshire and building the Birchend into a successful farm. He was a founder and director of the engineering firm, CWF; Chairman of the Malvern Hills District Council; Director of Food from Britain; an officer in the National Conservative Rural Action Group; Chairman of the British Hop Association; Chairman of the International Hop Grower's Congress among others. Martin was also a skilled silversmith and military historian.

Martin and Virginia, his wife of almost fifty years, opened up their home at the Moorend to local families to swim in the summer and for many Castle Frome events. These included the annual rounders event with swimming; the mulled red wine and nibbles during the carol singers tour around the parish and hosting harvest suppers and the Diamond Jubilee party. There was so much laughter and sharing at these events, always good food and time spent with others. He would always keep us on point with the raffle and our PCC meetings were never allowed to meander when Martin was in attendance. Martin was church Treasurer and also undertook tasks in the church and churchyard and made all the honey jars for our fundraising activities.

More widely, but especially in the parish of Castle Frome we will remember him with a smile and with thanks for personal kindnesses and will miss his presence among us. Rest in peace Martin in the churchyard, among the cowslips and close to the yew tree that you loved so well.

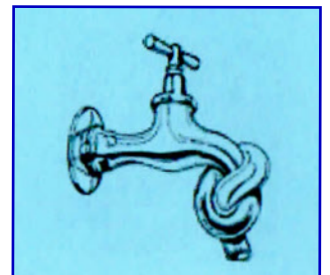

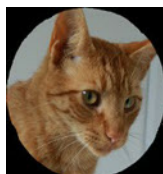

I'm writing this article on May Day, 1st May - earlier than usual because of printing deadlines. Since it's few days before the elections, I think it's best if I write a completely non-political article this month! So I thought I would write about two wonderful events I went to today: the Big Apple Blossomtime festival in Putley Village Hall, and the Bartonsham Meadow celebration in Hereford.



The Big Apple is a local festival that I absolutely love! Partly I think it's because it reminds me a bit of the village fetes I used to go to in Kent with my grandma; it has the same strong sense of community, of self-created entertainment and celebration. And it is always a wonderful celebration of the essence of Herefordshire, the apple! The May 'Blossomtime' event includes a wide range of walks through the lovely orchards and hills around Putley, as well as visits to cider- and perry-makers, and of course the annual Big Apple Cider and Perry Trials. Visitors can taste the prize-winning beverages during the rest of the weekend, and very fine they were too... And the October Harvesttime event is similarly wonderful. After the Big Apple I hopped onto my e-bike to make my way to Hereford, via the Woolhope Dome, for the Bartonsham Meadow May Day celebration. The journey was wonderful - glorious sunshine and glorious scenery! Herefordshire has so many stunningly beautiful areas...

My ride took me up hill and down dale (I was glad of the battery assistance!) and delivered me surprisingly quickly to the Scout Hut by Bartonsham Meadow in Hereford.

Perhaps you may have already heard about this wonderful community project? A dynamic group of community volunteers have come together as the Friends of Bartonsham Meadows (<http://www.friendsofbartonshammeadows.org/>) to save the meadows for the benefit of both wildlife and local people. It's a fantastic project, driven by immense energy of local community members who were concerned that ancient pasture had been ploughed up, leaving it exposed to flooding and causing serious loss of topsoil. Now, after several years of work, they have persuaded the Church Commissioners (which owns the land) to give Herefordshire Wildlife Trust a long lease, which means that this land can now be managed properly for public benefit.

Both of these events were joyful occasions, full of celebration of the heritage and landscape of Herefordshire - and the many fantastic people who make good things happen here. I feel lucky to be part of the wonderful community!

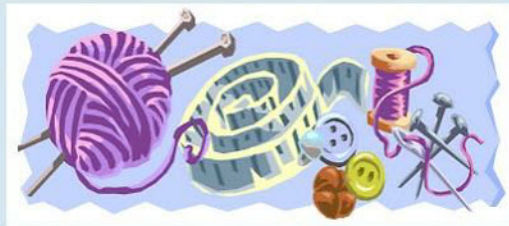
