

Associate Priest's Letter March 2024

As we journey into the Lent season many of our thoughts will almost certainly turn towards Easter. Not only is it the great festival of the Christian church but also a beacon for those with little or no faith, that brighter days lay ahead. This has not been the most auspicious start to a new year. Wars in the Middle East and Ukraine, a stuttering economy, political malaise, the uncertainty of future elections in this country and elsewhere, our Sovereign ill and just such unpredictable weather. It does not seem to bode well, and yet....



Something in the human nature and most certainly in our Christian belief looks for signs of hope. Be that the spring flowers as they peek out of the soil, the birdsong, the (very occasional) bright sunny day or perhaps in the warmth of friendship, our family or our community. And its not just a case of looking for hope, we can help build it in our homes, workplace and daily lives by small actions of love and kindness. Lent is the perfect time for that hope to start to appear. Many of you will be either giving something up for Lent or engaging in a Lenten discipline such as praying each day or giving more generously to charities or maybe just making time to call or visit that friend you have lost touch with. Whatever it is that you do, have you ever thought why? Well the obvious reason is that our tiny sacrifice matches the fasting that those in the past undertook but I think it goes deeper than that. In a way by giving up something for Lent we make our lives a tiny bit simpler and it seems to me that it is in the simple pleasures in life we can find that real hope and comfort we all long for. Plus whenever we think twice about having that biscuit or cake we have given up then maybe we might just think of sacrifices much greater than our own.

The greatest of these sacrifices for all Christians is the crucifixion and with that comes both our hope and redemption. A sacrifice built upon God's love. God's love which is all hope and never leaves us no matter how dark the days may seem. I don't say this because I am a priest or because I am a glass half full person. I say it because without hope and love in our lives there is little to keep us afloat in these turbulent times.

Plus Revd Steven is also running a Lent course of which the details can be found within. That just leaves me to wish you a thoughtful Lent and a peaceful, joyful and blessed Easter.

The event will cost approx. £8,000 (we had 800 last time £10 ahead) We have received a cheque from the Ferret racing to start us off (thank you)



Hereford's newest charity shop opens its doors

Eager shoppers queued to catch a first glimpse of Hereford's newest charity shop.

St Michael's Hospice opened its Eign Gate unit in the former Iceland store on Friday morning (9th). With over 4,000 square feet of shopping space, the premises is packed with pre-loved items including clothing, children's toys, homeware and music.

"I love the shop. It looks inviting, and the stock is really fresh," said one of the first shoppers, Emily Jones. "I shop at St Michael's shops three or four times a week. I'm always keen to support

the Hospice because I know that my money is going straight back into the community. I just love the aspect of never knowing what you might find. Everything I wear is from a charity shop, often St Michael's, and I'll often re-donate too."

The shop was opened by Jo, one of the Hospice's IPU nurses, and the Mayor of Hereford, Cllr Jacqui Carwardine. The Hospice's Chief Executive, Mike Keel, welcomed shoppers before the ribbon was cut.

The shop has been gathering interest from keen charity

shoppers since St Michael's first announced it was taking over the lease. The shop is located at 25 Eign Gate, Hereford and will be open from 9am – 5pm, Monday to Saturday. Donations are accepted in store during these times and at the donation zone at the rear of the shop on West Street.

A winter flock of goldcrests brightens up a dull day

The tiny goldcrest is a frequent visitor to the conifer hedge leading to the church. Along with the firecrest, it wins the prize for being Britain's smallest native breeding bird – weighing just 5 or 6g. I struggle to hear the goldcrest: its thin, high-pitched, zeee zeee zeee call is almost out of my range, but I love to see the flash of colour from its bold head stripe as it flits hurriedly amongst the foliage in search of insects. A cold winter can be disastrous for this diminutive bird, but there are good numbers currently – topped up with winter migrants from far off lands.







From The Diocese

I have just read the Rule of St. Benedict, to my shame for the first time. It is a monastic rule from the 6th century that sets out the disciplines and structures for the effective running of a monastery. The rules of poverty, chastity and obedience are highly restrictive; the punishments for violations severe; the lifestyle highly demanding.

Praying at set offices eight times a day (including at 2 in the morning) meant that the monk would rarely get more than few hours of unbroken sleep. Central heating was for wimps and the diet



uninspiring. Although eased in later centuries, it has been the basis for the monastic tradition in Western Europe ever since. Its not the sort of discipline that works in everyday life, but that doesn't mean it has no value. It is designed to foster Christian virtues of humility, and obedience (albeit expressed through submission to the Abbot), and a growing Christlikeness.

Most of March will be the season of Lent, when we Christians have traditionally given up things that give us pleasure to focus on our spiritual journey. As our world has changed it seems increasingly anachronistic. Our culture screams at us from the lifestyle sections that the way to real fulfilment is getting what you really desire. The idea that giving something up might be good for you, other than as a grudging acknowledgement of post-Christmas weight gain, is anathema. Consumerism works by creating desire and then offering to fulfil it. But our strongest desires are not necessarily our deepest ones. Giving things up, or fasting can get us in touch with these deeper desires that only God can satisfy.

There is evidence that restricting calories by intermittent fasting or turning our mobiles off is actually good for us physically and psychologically. A good lent can be like leaving the Christmas presents unopened under the tree until Christmas day. There is a joy in the opening that is enhanced by the waiting. So, as well as helping us grow closer to God, our Lenten restraint can amplify the joy of Christ risen when we get to that glorious Easter celebration.

I once gave up tea and coffee for lent and had my first large cup on Easter morning. Before I knew it, I'd done three services and built a compost heap! Lent can be spiritual dynamite.
