

Vicar's Letter

When having a moan is a good thing – God's gift of lament for difficult times

How long, Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and day after day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me? Look on me and answer, Lord my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death, and my enemy will say, "I have overcome him," and my foes will rejoice when I fall. But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. (Psalm 13:1-5)



Over the last few years, it would be an understatement to say that we have lived through 'interesting times', with BREXIT, COVID, the Russian invasion of Ukraine, the death of our Queen, high energy prices and the cost-of-living crisis. In times of adversity, it is easy feel that God is a long way off, certainly the author of Psalm 13 thought so. However, the psalmist's difficulties, whatever they were, did not stop them praying honesty to the Lord. The Bible calls this way of praying lament. It is a gift from God to help us draw close to God during the tough times.

In psalms of lament, we see the psalmist crying out to God in sorrow, sometimes protesting about an injustice, or quite simply being honest about their own struggles. So how does lament work and why does God encourage his people to lament? Below are three reasons why lament is a good thing that can help us during difficult times.

- Lament remembers there Is a God who Is real Simply by pausing for a moment and telling God how we really feel we are recognising that God exists and that he is interested in us.
- *Lament remembers and can ask why?* Lament does not sweep troubles under the carpet, rather lament allows us to be real, to express our struggles and frustrations honestly to God.
- Lament moves us from despair to hope Somehow by God's grace, when we are honest with God, God in his grace works in us and our situation. Time and again in the psalms we see the psalmist moving from despair to hope. God has grown bigger, and the challenge being faced smaller.

My prayer for all of us is that no matter how tough the times we live in are, that through the gift of lament we would all experience more of God's presence in our lives.

Wildlife in Autumn

There is still much wildlife activity this month, but nectar and pollen can get a bit trickier for insects to find. If you have a garden, some late flowering plants such as Michaelmas daisies will help fill the void. Leave any seedheads for birds such as finches.

As well as seedheads, birds will be very grateful for any berry-bearing trees and shrubs through the autumn and winter months, and of course it's time to dust off bird tables and feeders.

If you haven't already, now is also a good time to thin out any overgrown garden ponds, remembering to leave any surplus vegetation on the edge for a day or two to let pond animals return home. I have done just that and it's fascinating to watch what appears out of the greenery!


Our Carol Service this year will replace the usual Matins service on December 10th. Hopefully mince pies and mulled wine will once again be available after the service!

Bellringing is a hugely enjoyable and rewarding pastime which can give years of pleasure once you have learnt the basics. It is also very sociable and a good way to get some upper body exercise.

Bellringing is a skill but it doesn't take long to learn how to handle a bell and join a team to ring before church services or at special occasions.





One of my roles on the council is Chairperson of the Connected Communities Scrutiny Committee, which deals with issues including the economy and transport. Scrutiny committees are an important part of how the council runs. They are cross-party, with seats allocated in proportion to the size of the political groups. Their job is basically to ask lots of questions!

The committee that I chair covers many fascinating topics. For example, we lead on scrutinising the new administration's proposal to scrap the Maylords Orchards library project and put the library in the Shire Hall instead. You may remember I mentioned this I my



column last month. My committee asked a lot of very detailed questions about this, and succeeded in persuading the administration not to cancel the Maylords project until a full business case had been prepared for the alternative site. We will be scrutinising that business case once it is ready, later this autumn.

Another topic that my committee is currently looking at is the development of the Local Transport Plan (LTP) and Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP). Today we had some very useful briefings on these emerging plans, and we will be discussing them at our next public meeting (date tbc, sometime in the next few weeks – I will post a notification on Facebook when the date is agreed). These transport strategy plans are really crucial – setting the direction for transport infrastructure for the coming decades.

This summer I went to the Nordic countries for the first time, and was enormously impressed with their transport infrastructure. I travelled by train because I avoid flying for environmental reasons – and train journeys are lovely, as you see the landscape change! It's also incredibly reasonably priced if you book in advance – for example, about £65 for a 17-hour overnight journey from Geneva to Copenhagen.

The infrastructure for walking and cycling in Denmark's capital Copenhagen is wonderful, meaning the city is incredibly easy to get around. Gothenburg on Sweden's west coast is equally good. I hired bicycles in both places and had a wonderful time exploring these vibrant, pedestrian-friendly and cyclist-friendly cities. What particularly impressed me was the fact that cars gave way to pedestrians rather than the other way round – the most vulnerable road users were prioritised.

This hasn't happened by accident – it's the result of long-term planning that recognises that places are for people! There are some fantastic resources online about this sort of planning. I especially recommend the YouTube channels 'Not Just Bikes' https://www.youtube.com/c/notjustbikes

and 'Streetfilms' https://www.youtube.com/@StreetfilmsCommunity,

both of which have some really informative and inspiring videos on this topic.

Here in Herefordshire we have a great opportunity to do this long-term planning too, and to create a much more effective transport system that gives people the widest possible range of options for getting around. In my work on the Connected Communities Scrutiny Committee I will be scrutinising the development of these plans to ensure that local people's views are heard, and that we learn from as many inspiring examples as possible!


