FROME VALLEY NEWS COLLECTION DAY

Vicar's Letter,

I don't know about you but I'm not always too fond of change. It's so easy to assume that what is familiar is always right, and anything new is clearly wrong. Having said that I do find change interesting and I find myself wondering what things will look like after they have changed, change can be quite exciting. Change often takes us out of our familiar comfort zone and encourages us to experience things in a new way.

Jesus followers often had a hard time accepting the changes that he seemed to bring. He always seemed to turn everything they thought they knew backwards and inside out. If Jesus was the Messiah, then clearly He was going to rule Israel and get rid of those Roman invaders, and



they wanted to be his right-hand men, sharing the power and the glory. Unimportant people like women and children would clearly be beneath the Messiah's concern, and Samaritans and Gentiles clearly wouldn't be included. The disciples wanted change...but the change Jesus came to bring wasn't what they expected or thought they needed.

St. Paul wrote about how the reality of being accepted by Christ would change the status of both the privileged and underdogs in Galatians 3:28 – "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus."

In our own context we face continuing change. The Diocese of Hereford has 73 paid clergy and collects enough money in from the parishes to pay 55 of us. So consequently we face more change as the church relies less on paid professionals and more on volunteers, both lay and ordained. In our Deanery that means we will inevitably lose one of our three remaining paid posts and that Bromyard Deanery will eventually merge with Ledbury. I anticipate a changing pattern of working where I spend more time supporting the needs of a larger group of thinly spread clergy across a wider area and less time with people in the benefice.

Within our own benefice change is happening all around us as we come to terms with changing patterns of church attendance. St Matthew's Church, Fromes Hill is still going through the process of closure. Stanford Bishop and Ocle Pychard PCC's have both made the decision to join Evesbatch in becoming Festival Churches. Stopping a regular pattern of worship that is clearly unsustainable will allow these churches to take a more flexible approach to worship and to focus limited resources. Becoming a festival church doesn't solve all our problems but it at least gives PCC's and congregations the space to think creatively about worship and community engagement and keeps our churches open.

As we look forward once again in anticipation to celebrating the incarnation in the person of the Christ child this Christmas, may we all reflect on the huge changes that he brought with him. Change is difficult, sometimes really difficult, but it is what God calls us to as we strive to fully

live "in Christ." in an ever changing world.



Report on the Deanery Synod meeting - Thursday 27th October 2022

On Thursday 27th October Deanery Synod meet at Bishops Frome Village Hall.

After tea and coffee at 7pm we were welcomed by the chairman Rev Steven Baggs who introduced the Rev Dr Elizabeth Wild, Local Ministry Lead for Hereford Diocese and Chris Evans a Licensed Reader from Whitbourne.

Chris Evans gave a brief introduction and told everybody about the deanery 'get together' he had organised in March under the theme "If you have to walk on water you have to get out of the boat". A meeting to encourage Christians in the Bromyard deanery to take up 'Lay Leadership'. Following on from this, a number of people have been attending a monthly course at St Peter's Bromyard, led by Elizabeth Wild and Chris. This started in July and will end at the end of November.

Martin Hewitt and Moyra Taylor, who are attending this Leadership course then led the Synod meeting in prayer.

Chris Evans then explained that not all the people attending the course want to become Lay Leaders of Worship, and that the courses will continue with one focused on Pastoral Care, and one on Mission. He was pleased to announce that nine people will be commissioned in the near future by the Bishop of Hereford as Lay Leaders of Worship.

He then asked six course members who were present at the meeting to share what they had gained from the Leadership Course. They all said how much they had found the course most interesting, enlightening, and genuinely meaningful, and how it would enable them to make a difference in their parishes and churches.

Chris went on to say he hoped it would encourage others to follow the same path as these prospective Lay Leaders, or as Pastoral Carers and Missioners. Elizabeth Wild also spoke about how she had recently been appointed to the Diocese to further this sort of work, and had been so pleased to find that it had already been started in Bromyard.

Steven Baggs as Chairman of the meeting thanked Chris, Elizabeth and the future Lay Readers for their contribution to the meeting and then continued with the business matters of the Synod.

Steven told us that due to lack of funds, in time, the number of paid stipendiary clergy in the Hereford Diocese would have to go down from the present 73 to 55 and would therefore be more dependent of Lay people! Also, that the Bromyard Deanery would join with that of Ledbury, and he had been asked to take over that greater role.

Roger Wilkins from Bromyard was appointed as Lay Co Chair of the Deanery Synod.

Steven held a discussion about speakers for future meetings.

Martin Hewitt closed the meeting in prayer.

The next meeting of the synod will be on 23rd February in St Peter's Parish Room, Bromyard with Mandy Mcphee Diocesan Safeguarding Officer speaking about Safeguarding at the Parish Level. Anyone interested in finding out more is welcome to attend.






DECEMBER 2022

From the Bishop:

Most years when I was a parish priest in Sussex a group of us used to go Carol singing. We'd visit homes and the local pubs. Rather than asking for money for a charity or Church funds we would finish by giving out mince pies. This always threw people. They wanted to pay for them. They couldn't believe there wasn't some sort of catch. I'm sure it would be even worse were I to do it today. We've got so wary of scam calls, texts and emails, we are immediately suspicious of anything that seems too good to be true.



We often refer to Christ's coming at Christmas in terms of gifts. The word became flesh and dwelt among us. Unbidden and unsought, Christ comes to earth to reveal what God is like in a way that eludes human reason. The Christian story is something no one could have made up as a recipe for a restored relationship with God. But gift and the allied term grace are what it is all about.

This Christmas we are acutely aware of life's intractable problems. How on earth are we to solve the climate crisis, the economic crisis, the international relations crisis brought on by the war in Ukraine? All these problems seem unsolvable given normal patterns of human behaviour. How can a baby born in the backwater of an ancient empire 2000 years ago have anything to say about any of them? But the gift of Jesus is simple without being simplistic. The heart of most problems is the problem of the human heart. Jesus offers us the gift that meets the needs we seek to fill with rapacious consumption. He offers the security that frees us to love. He offers us the peace that in trust releases generosity. He offers the forgiveness that releases us from defensiveness and self-justification. The Gospel is good news because it meets the deepest needs of the human heart. This is where the real transformation of individuals and society is to be found.

Postcards from Life raises almost £8,000 for St Michael's Hospice

Dozens of St Michael's Hospice supporters are now the proud owners of beautiful art after an annual auction reached an exciting finale.

When the hammer closed on the final Postcards from Life lot, more than £7,800 had been raised for the Bartestree-based Hospice.

This year's event saw the widest array of art in Postcards history, with well over 250 pieces submitted from some of the finest artists around.

The final few hours of the fortnight-long auction saw a flurry of bids with the top lot - a beautiful robin by Lin Gardner - fetching £155.

"Painting brings me joy as does helping others; to combine the two and also discover the amount raised on my little robin has really brought the biggest smile," said Lin.

Artists were invited to submit postcard-sized work with a free choice of subject matter. In total, 1,936 bids were cast, with bidders ranging from Herefordshire-based supporters to those as far away as the United States. Auctioneers Brightwells supported the bidding site and reported more than 10,500 views of the listing page.

"This year in particular, given all the pressures on people's finances, we are so grateful to those who bid during Postcards from Life," said event organiser, Gaynor Warren. "We hope the successful bidders will enjoy the art which is sure to brighten any room. Over the years, this auction has often been referred to as 'the small art with a big heart', which is fitting as the proceeds go straight towards our patient care. Thank you so much to everyone who bid."

The final figure includes generous sponsorship by Framing Workshop in Hereford. For the first time there was also a Postcards Trail at four venues across Hereford city centre where would-be bidders could glimpse the artwork in person.

Wildlife in December

December is a time when the days are short, the nights are long and the temperatures cold. When you first look it may seem like the natural world has gone to sleep, look a little closer and you'll find that there's plenty to spot, from squirrels to vibrant winter birds, and from stoats to brown hares and Muntjac Deer.

With their small stature and the fact they lurk in dense undergrowth, muntjacs are often not always seen. But in winter, with the vegetation dying back it may improve your chances of a seeing some. The introduced deer – originally from south-east China – are most active around dawn and dusk. Look out for animals the size of a Collie, with a hunch-backed profile and tiny, hook-like antlers in males.


