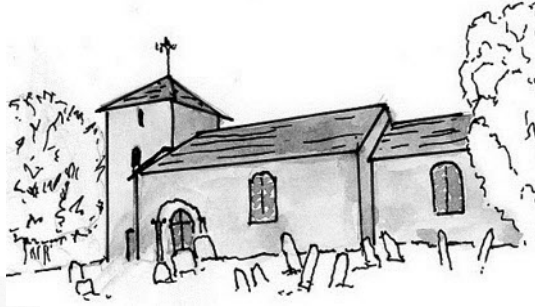
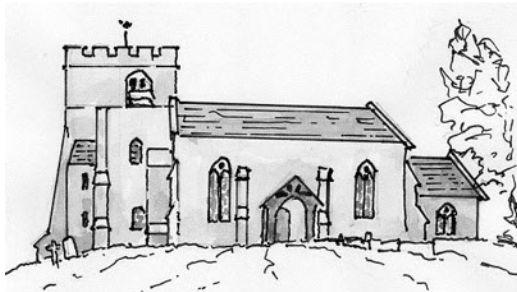
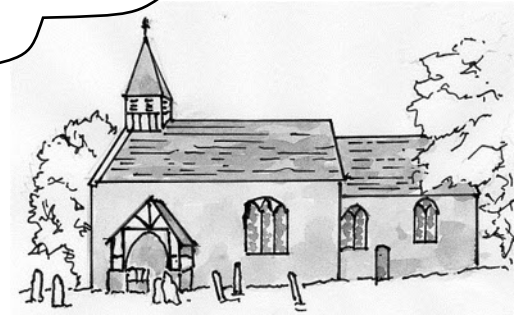

## Associate Priest's Letter,

Sometimes change comes slowly in life and at other times it seems that we are on a roller coaster of change that impact us either individually or as a nation. The last few years have seen such a period, 4 prime ministers, Brexit, Covid, war in Ukraine and now more significantly for many of us a new monarch.



Some of you will have embraced these changes and accepted them almost without blinking. For others these changes will have been unsettling and a cause for concern and anxiety. It is inevitable that change will occur but it is the pace and profundity of change that can knock us off balance. It is easy to offer advice on how to cope with change but it rarely works for everyone and the advice often may seem superficial or inappropriate. Inner peace and calm are what we seek and change rarely gives us that.

Some people argue that if you have faith then this is a source of comfort in troubled times and indeed it is, but faith is something many of us have to grapple with or it may not come naturally. Christ taught us to put our faith in God but more than that he gave us a simple and new commandment to make life easier and to promote peace on earth. You may be thinking right now which teaching I am talking about and whether there is any simple way to make life not just bearable but fruitful.

Yet when Christ told his disciples to 'love one another', it was an instruction not to just his followers but to us all. Love means giving and forgiving and may not always come easily but I believe it is the only route to inner peace and contentment. It is certainly a better way of dealing with change than either putting your head in the sand and trying to cut yourself off from whatever problem is confronting you. And much, much better than ignoring a change by diversions or hedonism, no matter if they give a temporary feel good sensation.

What we need is something deeper and more certain. Christ's commandment is not easy to follow but it provides certainty in this uncertain world. Queen Elizabeth was a person of very deep faith and given the many changes and difficult times she had to face in her life I can only surmise that her faith enabled her to keep going no matter what. With faith comes constancy and continuity. And continuity is another way of seeking peace and certainty. Those of you who attend church will know that there is a continuity in terms of our prayers, hymns and worship. Often when we use the Book of Common Prayer the very language seems to seep into us and we know the words from deep within our memories. This is the sort of certainty that helps in times of change, a continuity of love.

God bless you all and God save the King.

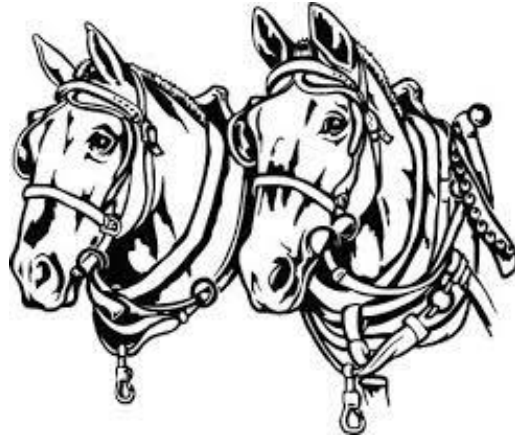

Acton Beauchamp PCC and the wider Church community wish them all the very, very best for their future.



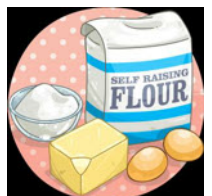
**Calling all local artists and crafters!**

Just a few months ago our communities came together to joyfully celebrate the Queen's Jubilee; now, we are gathering to mourn her passing. It seems like a fitting time to reflect on the values of dedicated service and commitment to others that characterised her life, and that have inspired so many.



Watching the tributes and reflections on her reign I've been reflecting on how much has changed in the last 70 years – and I can't help wondering what the next 70 years will bring.

I've been reminded of the idea of the '100-year newspaper', which I read about in an excellent book by Tim Harford, 'How to Make the World Add Up'. (Tim Harford is the Financial Times journalist who hosts the BBC's More or Less programme which 'explains - and sometimes debunks - the numbers and statistics used in political debate, the news and everyday life'.)

Harford asks us to consider what might be in the headlines of a newspaper that was published only once every 25, 50, or 100 years. Reflecting on this can help us take a step back from the day-to-day, in order to see what's really important over the long term.

Thinking back over the past 70 or more years, I wonder what each of us would identify as the most significant changes in our country and our world? And looking forward, what sort of changes would we like to see; how would we like things to be different when the children of today reach 70?

This sort of 'generational thinking' can, I think, help us focus on what's most important. And this point in our country's history, when we mark the passing of our longest-serving monarch, seems like a good opportunity for reflection on taking the long view – and on her example of a lifetime of public service.

Although I won't be here myself in 70 years' time, I hope my children might still be. And I hope that all those involved in public service will do everything possible to ensure that the world we pass to the next generation grows kinder, fairer, and more sustainable each year. That would be a legacy we can all be proud of.

## HER MAJESTY THE QUEEN ( 1926 - 2022)

Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, by the Grace of God Queen of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Defender of the Faith, who has died aged 96, was the longest-serving monarch of the United Kingdom. During a period of remarkable change throughout her realms and the world at large, she proved herself one of the most effective and best-loved sovereigns the nation has known.

From the moment of her accession to the throne, comparisons were made with her Tudor namesake; particularly in the assumption that the country's fortunes were, as in 1558, at a low ebb and that its one hope lay in the character of the new Queen. But few could have dared to believe Richard Dimbleby's declaration at the time of the Coronation – that “No more devoted or courageous person could carry on the monarchy, which is the lasting strength of Britain and the wonder and envy of a large part of the world” – would prove so accurate.

She lived well into the 21st century: alert and well informed until the end, with only minor concessions to old age, and then only when she was in her 90s. She remained a calm presence: steadfast, with a clear vision of her role as Britain's monarch and as Head of the Commonwealth, to both of which roles she was wholly committed.

As Queen she knew how to represent Britain; as a woman she was self-effacing, asking little for herself on a personal level. Duty was her watchword, and at the end of a long life of duty fulfilled, her achievements were remarkable.

A hallmark of her reign were the many acts of conciliation and reconciliation, evidenced in her receiving President Theodor Heuss of Germany in 1958 and her important three-week visit to West Germany in 1965. There were conciliatory state visits between Britain and Japan (in 1971 and 1975, and in 1998, some not without controversy), and the Queen was able to mark political changes by visiting China in 1986, and Russia in 1994.

Fresher in the public memory was her ground-breaking visit to Ireland in 2011 and the return state visit (of the Irish president Michael Higgins) to Windsor in 2014. In all these endeavours, she and her husband the Duke of Edinburgh sought to put aside the differences of the past and took steps to ensure an easier climate for the future.

Against many predictions, the nation (and even, eventually, the Labour government) responded to the Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977 with enthusiasm, staging events and bunting-festooned street parties. And by the time of her Golden Jubilee year in 2002, the widespread demonstrations of affection and loyalty from her subjects were as strong as those of half a century before. The celebrations which then marked her Diamond Jubilee in 2012 – a year crowned, most memorably, by her triumphant “arrival” by parachute at the opening ceremony of the London Olympics – showed a nation united in its affection for its monarch and at ease with the centuries-old institution she embodied. That she lived to celebrate the unique milestone of a Platinum Jubilee was nothing short of remarkable.

The very nature of those celebrations, and the warmth and good humour that underpinned them, made the point that this had been an enormously successful reign by a devoted and popular monarch.

Throughout her reign the Queen was nobly supported by Prince Philip, ever at her side until he stepped down from public duties in 2017 at the age of 96. He lived on until 2021, dying shortly before his 100th birthday.



At moments such as the Diamond Jubilee (the Queen resisted national celebrations for occasions such as her Sapphire Jubilee in 2017 and the 70th anniversary of her marriage in the same year), it was hard to remember that, from time to time during her reign, there had been debate over the role and future of the monarchy. Even during those difficult periods, however, there was no debate about the good fortune that the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth had enjoyed under the reign of the Queen herself.

The most virulent republicans conceded that it was impossible to imagine any other figure who could have carried the burdens of the Head of State so effectively and graciously, or provided such a unifying presence.

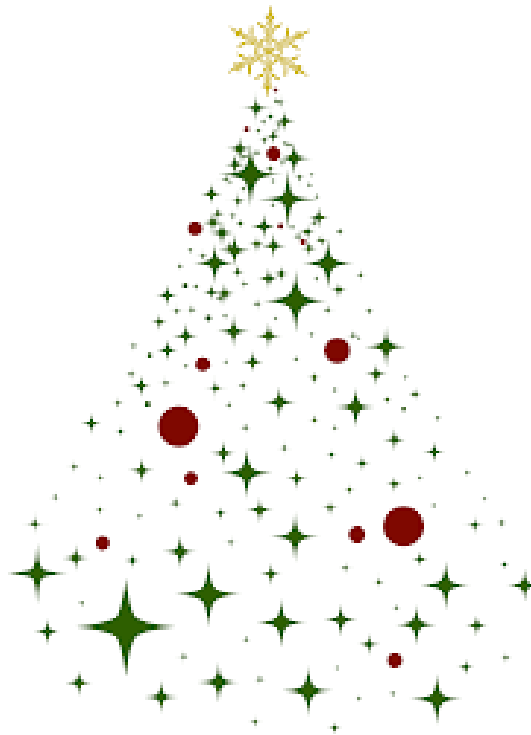
She had made clear her dedication to the task on the occasion of her 21st birthday when, as Princess Elizabeth, she made a moving declaration from Cape Town that was broadcast across the Empire:

**“I declare before you all that my whole life, whether it be long or short, shall be devoted to your service and the service of our great imperial family to which we all belong. But I shall not have the strength to carry out this resolution alone unless you join in it with me, as I now invite you to do: I know that your support will be unfailingly given. God help me to make good my vow, and God bless all of you who are willing to share in it.”**

It was the great blessing of Elizabeth II’s reign, and the great good fortune of her subjects, that she succeeded in this to a degree that could not have been expected or even hoped for.

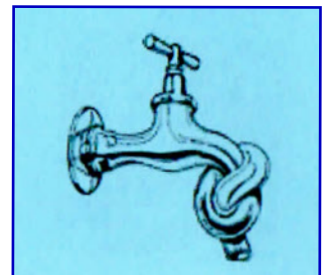

From Bishop Richard

It is with great sadness that we heard the news this evening (Thursday 8 September 2022) of the death of Her Majesty, The Queen. She has been a constant in our lives for eight decades and has been steadfast in Her service to our country and The Commonwealth. Her reign will be remembered for her witness to some of the biggest historical moments of the last century: the Second World War, international crises financial and military, a global pandemic, and the rise of postmodern societies, global consumerism, travel, superpowers as well as an exceptional explosion of technology. Many great historians will write far better words than I can write.

Despite witnessing so much change, she has managed to remain both constant and evolving. She redefined the British monarchy whilst maintaining the mystery of this much revered and loved British institution in an era where the level of public scrutiny has increased with every passing decade of Her reign. Throughout her reign, her faith in Jesus Christ remained the bedrock on which she built her life. Her role as Supreme Head of the Church of England was not a mere title but something about which she was passionate.

I had the privilege of meeting Her Majesty at the start of my time as Bishop of Hereford when I participated in the traditional ceremony of homage. I was the seventh Bishop of Hereford to do so in Her Majesty's reign. She was both dignified and informal and we were able to chat for some time at the conclusion of the ceremony. She was well informed about our diocese and my own circumstances. She visited the Cathedral on four separate occasions and the diocese for a number of other formal royal events. As many have said, when she spoke to you, she made you feel as if you were the only person there.

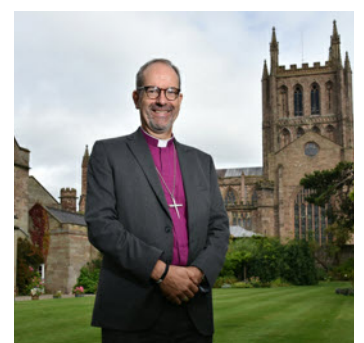
This is a global moment of deep and profound grief that will be felt by many. Her 70-year reign will fill the history books as we mark the end of the second Elizabethan era in this country.
